Kelantan-resolutions

KELANTAN BN'S RESOLUTIONS, A REFLECTION OF THE PEOPLE'S ASPIRATIONS

MACHANG, Dec 20 (Bernama) -- Kelantan Barisan Nasional (BN) Kelantan has introduced 18 resolutions, many of which touch on development efforts in religion, social and economy to prepare the state for future challenges.

The resolutions were drawn up in conjunction with the one-day Kelantan BN convention which was opened by Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi here today.

The convention's resolutions committee chairman, Datuk Ibrahim Ali said the resolutions which reflected the aspirations of the people were the result of deliberations by 2,500 participants of 13 workshop organised.

"The resolutions are also part of the preparations to face the next general election and would be implemented if the BN is voted to power again in Kelantan," he said.

He said the resolutions took into account the current problems which had hampered progress for the state and the people.

The resolutions, among others, also thank Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, his deputy Abdullah and the federal government for continuing to provide financial allocations which serve as the main drive to the state's socio-economic development.

On religion, the resolutions call for intensified efforts to propagate the teachings of Islam and the restructuring of the Kelantan Islamic Foundation (YIK) while in education, for more schools and an international standard university be set up in Kelantan.

On economy, the resolutions say Kelantan BN leaders will strive to provide more jobs and set up agro-based industries while promising to provide land to the landless.

Ibrahim later presented the resolution to state BN chairman Datuk Mustapa Mohamed.
