`Women must adapt to new challenges'

KAJANG, Tues. - The demands of the new millennium should not force women to be more like men; instead, they should adapt to the challenges, said Datuk Seri Dr Siti Hasmah Mohd Ali, wife of Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad.

Giving a talk on A Woman's Role to the Finance Ministry's Puspanita branch, she said it was possible for women to adapt to new challenges.

Dr Siti Hasmah also called on women to be committed in the fight for their rights and dignity, but not to be caught up in women's issues with hidden agendas.

She said that a clear understanding of socio-cultural and religious matters would ensure women their basic rights.
