Nik Mohamed resigns as SRAM president

DATUK Nik Mohamed Din resigned as the president of Squash Rackets Association of Malaysia (SRAM) on Oct 15 citing poor health as the reason.

Nik Mohamed, president since Jan 1 2000, was one of the longest serving members of SRAM. Appointed as committee member on Aug 29, 1973, he was made the vice-president when the late Tan Sri Alex Lee took over the presidency from Tan Sri Tunku Imran Tuanku Ja'afar in 1990 when Tunku Imran was elected as the president of World Squash Federation.

Nik Mohamed became the president of SRAM upon the tragic death of Alex Lim on 31 Oct 1999.

Nik Mohamed, a national champion in 1974, 1976 and 1977, contributed hugely to the success of SRAM as vice-president and president.

"SRAM is pleased to inform that Datuk Mokhzani Mahathir, deputy-president of SRAM, will be the acting president until the forthcoming Annual General Meeting on Dec 22 this year," said SRAM executive director Lt Col (r) Wong Ah Jit.

"SRAM is confident that Mokhzani, in his early 40s, energetic and a former president of Asian Squash Federation, is most likely to be the SRAM president effective Jan 1, 2003," said Wong.
