Police complete investigation into Bunyamin's allegation against Dr M

MALACCA, Sat. - The police investigation into the case involving an allegation made by a Pas speaker from Kelantan against Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad, has been completed.

Bunyamin Yaakob, 51, was alleged to have said during a Pas ceramah at the Pusat Tarbiyah Islamiah Kelantan in Pengkalan Chepa on March 15 that Dr Mahathir had watched a pornographic video with his grandchildren.

Inspector-General of Police Tan Sri Norian Mai said today that the investigation papers would be forwarded to the Attorney-General's Chambers.

He said police had recorded statements from about 20 people, including Bunyamin.

"Although we still need to record statements from one or two more people, police investigations into the matter have been completed," Norian said after opening the new Alor Gajah district police headquarters and 194 units of staff quarters in Lesung Batu, Alor Gajah.

The RM22-million project also includes a multi-purpose hall, a surau, a kindergarten and a parade ground.

On allegations that several former Al-Arqam members were trying to revive the movement, Norian said the police were keeping tabs.

He added that police had alerted the authorities, including the Religious Affairs Department, on several matters which were out of the police's jurisdiction.
