

Keng Yaik to continue as long as needed

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PENANG: Gerakan president Datuk Seri Dr Lim Keng Yaik said he will not resign his party post, but will continue to lead as long as he is needed by the party. He said although his BN counterpart Umno president Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad has said he will step down in October, and MCA president Datuk Seri Dr Ling Liong Sik has resigned his post, there were no reasons for him to leave his party at this point. "Why should I have to go, give me 101 reasons for this first," Lim told reporters when asked if he was considering resigning from his post, after chairing a Gerakan Central Committee meeting at a hotel here on Saturday.
