

I do not hate Dr Mahathir, says Wan Azizah

PARTI Keadilan Nasional president Datin Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail said she does not hate Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad. As the Prime Minister had contributed a lot to the country, she said it was difficult to judge him.

Stating her views on the outgoing Prime Minister in the "Tribute to Dr Mahathir" series in the *Nanyang Siang Pau*, she added: "The Petronas Twin Towers, Putrajaya and the KL International Airport (KLIA) are all magnificent, splendid and grand architectures."

However, the KLIA has a very high-tech exterior but low passenger load and aircraft landing rates, she said.

Dr Wan Azizah, wife of former Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, said: "I always tell myself and my children not to be angry because anger and hatred will blur our vision.

"I am a Muslim and I will maintain rationality and leave everything to Allah."

Commenting on an interview with Dr Mahathir in the *Sin Chew*

Daily, she said if sacking and jailing Anwar had made the Prime Minister upset, he should have released him.

The *China Press* reported on a parent's concern about a discrepancy in the Mathematics Paper One in the recent PMR examination.

Several mathematicians interviewed agreed with the parent from Alor Star that none of the choice answers provided matched the actual answer of the sum given.

The answer for the sum, $162 \div 2 (6 + 3)$, is 729.

But this was not among the answers which students could select from.

China Press said the issue surfaced because of a confusion in working out the sum.

A former Universiti Malaya Mathematics professor, Dr Lin Zhong Qiang, said the answer should be 729.

"There is nothing wrong with the problem. But this might confuse students.

"The Education Department should avoid such ambiguity in future Mathematics Papers," he said.
