S'GOR MCA YOUTH ISSUES FIVE RESOLUTIONS AT ASSEMBLY

SHAH ALAM, July 27 (Bernama) -- Selangor MCA Youth has proposed five resolutions on the party, politics, economy, community and education at its 34th General Assembly here today launched by MCA President Datuk Seri Ong Ka Ting.

In a statement issued in conjunction with the assembly, the resolution acknowledged the contributions of former President Datuk Seri Dr Ling Liong Sik and his deputy Datuk Lim Ah Lek.

"Their resignation and making way for leaders of their choice shows that MCA is a responsible team," the statement said.

The resolution which supported the leadership of Datuk Seri Ong Ka Ting as president, and Datuk Chan Kong Choy as deputy, urged the president to consider fielding MCA Youth members in the upcoming general election.

It was also in favour of limiting the tenure of party president, youth president and wanita chief to three terms.

The Selangor MCA Youth said its respected the wishes of Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad to resign and promised to support his successor Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi to maintain the stability of the Barisan Nasional.

The resolution urged the Chinese to join the Royal Malaysia Police and the Armed Force. It also fully supported measures to eradicate pornographic and pirated optical discs menace.

It commended the MCA's for setting up Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman and urged the Education Ministry to be fair and transparent in allocating seats based on merit in public universities.

The resolution also supported government efforts to give more opportunities to other races to apply for Public Service Department scholarships and hoped that the policy would continue to be used.
