Use posters to expose Pas, BN urged

ALOR STAR, Sat. - Kedah Barisan Nasional chairman Datuk Seri Syed Razak Syed Zain urged each component party member to put up a poster of Pas' wrongdoings, to expose the Opposition party.

Saying that this would help crush Pas in the next general election, Syed Razak added that the posters would persuade fence-sitters to reject Pas in the election.

"If all 278,762 BN members in the coalition's 1,912 branches put up one poster each, there will be 278,762 posters every where throughout the State telling the people of Pas' abuses.

"We must not be cowed. We must stand up to Pas and challenge them... We must smoke them out and drive them out of the State forever.

"Their manifestos and speeches will be relegated to the annals of history to be viewed as mere artefacts in a museum," Syed Razak said in his speech at the launch of Kedah BN's election machinery at Sultan Abdul Halim Stadium, Jalan Suka Menanti, today.

Also present were Kedah BN adviser Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad and leaders of Kedah BN component parties.

Syed Razak's suggestion for the BN component party members was part of nine points he gave in his speech for the coalition to achieve victory in the next general election.

The other points are:

- * component party members must work sincerely and voluntarily without expecting any financial returns;
- * members should accept whoever the coalition chooses as a candidate and not work to sabotage his or her chances of winning;
- * using the coalition's machinery to win the election, not as a vehicle to lobby for oneself;
- * updating the machinery's data banks with the latest voter figures, supporters and voter profiles;
- * maximising the divisions' strength to field all its workers during the election;
- * rejecting factionalism and individualism as this would lead to lobbying and sabotage;
- * to correctly use the coalition's funds for the election instead of using them for personal gain; and,
- * to use the soft approach when meeting the people as opposed to the radical tactics employed by the Opposition.
