Inviting Langkawi Lagoon Resort

FACING the calm waters of Andaman Sea, a new kid on the block is set to complement other attractions in Langkawi.

The property in question is the Langkawi Lagoon Resort, all set for the official launch by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad on Mar 1.

The MK Land project is developed and owned by its subsidiary Tema Teladan and managed by another subsidiary Pujaan Pasifik.

The resort is about five minutes' drive from the Langkawi International Airport and easily accessible via ferry from Kuala Perlis or Kuala Kedah.

It offers a variety of accommodation, from Studio Suites located at the beachfront to the D'Villas and D'Bungalows which offer the unique experience of living over the sea.

The resort harmonises the sanctuary of calm waters protected from the open sea by an impressive RM200 million breakwater structure.

Langkawi Lagoon is the third MK Land resort - the others being the Bukit Merah Lake Town Resort completed some five years ago and the Taiping Golf and Country Club.

Phase One of the 23.75 ha resort costs some RM60 million comprising 96 hotel suites, 96 villas and 42 bungalows.

Currently, 92 suites and 12 villas on the water are ready and open for business. Guests staying at the villas or enjoying strolls on the wooden walkways have a great view, including fish swimming in the shimmering clear waters.

This project is expected to be fully completed in 10 years at a cost of RM600 million. There will be more studio units and bungalows being built over the sea.
