MIC Youth wants bigger allocation for Tamil schools

MIC Youth today passed a resolution asking the Prime Minister for a bigger allocation to upgrade Tamil schools.

The movement expressed gratitude to Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad for his support. It expressed regret that certain Barisan Nasional leaders had criticised the educational quality of Tamil schools.

The movement passed a resolution pledging to support Dr Mahathir and party president Datuk Seri S. Samy Vellu's leadership.

The convention also asked the Education Ministry to introduce religious classes for all races and moral education to help curb social problems among youths.

Youth members expressed regret over several deaths in police lock-ups and urged the Home Ministry to investigate these cases.

Another resolution was passed urging the Housing and Local Government Ministry to establish a committee consisting of Indian officials to oversee the relocation of Hindu temples in the country.

The convention also called upon Dr Mahathir, who is Barisan Nasional chairman, to give the MIC more seats to contest in the next general election, based on the party's performance.
