DR MAHATHIR CHAIRS HIS LAST CABINET MEETING

PUTRAJAYA, Oct 29 (Bernama) -- Datuk Seri Dr Mahathir Mohamad today chaired the 883rd weekly Cabinet meeting, his last before stepping down as the fourth Prime Minister on Friday.

Dr Mahathir chaired his first Cabinet meeting on July 22 1981 following his appointment as Prime Minister on July 16.

Prior to the meeting at 9.45 am at the Prime Minister's Office here, Dr Mahathir posed for a group photograph with the Cabinet ministers at the lobby.

Present was his successor, Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi, who is scheduled to be sworn in as the fifth Prime Minister of Malaysia at the Istana Negara on Friday afternoon.

Dr Mahathir also posed for a photograph with officers and staff of the Cabinet, Constitution and Inter-Government Relations Division at the Prime Minister's Department. They later presented him with a framed fabric with the figure '883' woven onto it.

Several ministers met earlier expressed their highest appreciation for Dr Mahathir's contributions to the nation and their confidence in Abdullah's ability to pursue the struggles for Malaysia to attain greater achievements.

Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin said that Dr Mahathir had charted clearly the future of the nation through his vision.

Congratulating Abdullah, Muhyiddin said: "We are confident of his ability in carrying out the responsibility entrusted upon him to pursue the struggles for Malaysia's better and brighter future."
