

SPEECH BY THE PRIME MINISTER AT THE
OPENING OF THE INAUGURAL CONFERENCE
OF THE INTERNATIONAL ISLAMIC NEWS
AGENCY (IINA) AT DEWAN TUNKU ABDUL
RAHMAN, KUALA LUMPUR ON 16TH AUGUST,
1972

Assalam mualaikum warahmatullahi wabarakatuh,

Mr Chairman, Secretary General of Islamic Secretariat,¹
Distinguished Delegates, Ladies and Gentlemen.

It is indeed a privilege and an honour for me to be here at this auspicious occasion—the inauguration of the International Islamic News Agency.

On behalf of the Government and people of Malaysia, I wish to extend a warm welcome to all Distinguished Delegates to Kuala Lumpur. Your presence at this August gathering is indeed a source of pride and inspiration to our people.

We in Malaysia are proud for being given this singular honour to play host to this historic Conference but the fact that impresses me most is that many of you have come from far and near to uphold the torch of enlightenment for the sake of Islam. May I, therefore take this opportunity to convey through you, to your respective governments that the Government and people of Malaysia are overwhelmed by the trust and confidence which you have placed upon us.

Distinguished Delegates,

The Islamic Secretariat has made significant progress since its inception nearly three years ago. Today's event is another milestone in its onward progress to promote the interests of Islam. We all realize that the successful pursuit of our ultimate objectives can only stem from our realization and awareness of the constraints and impediments that confront us, as well as the hopes and ideals for which we aspire. It is imperative that we should foster close

co-operation among the constituent member nations which ultimately constitute the sum and substance of the objectives as enshrined in the charter of the Islamic Secretariat.

In this context, I believe IINA can play a positive role in helping to realize the said objectives which would bind not only the leaders and Governments of fraternal Muslim nations but more so the respective peoples of all walks of life.

I am sure you will all agree with me that in this present world of ours, there is an urgent need to strengthen the role of news media in our respective countries. The direct interlink between socio-economic progress and the growth of news media has been recognised. Thus, the setting up of IINA is a clear recognition of this need which, besides enhancing the common bonds of religion, would help speed up changes consistent with the process of modernization in Islamic Society.

Distinguished Delegates,

IINA has a heavy and difficult task ahead. We would only indulge in self-delusion if we think that it can achieve its objectives within a span of a few years, for a cohesive and progressive IINA can only be built on a solid and durable foundation. In our case, we are a young nation and so is our national news organisation BERNAMA. In view of this, there should be close and sustained collaboration and co-ordination between member states to ensure that the policies and objectives would be aligned towards achieving the common goal.

Having expressed our resolve and determination with the establishment of IINA, it is important to see that this resolve of ours should not fail owing to lack of support. Unless we add meaning and substance to our determination, I am afraid the future of the Islamic Secretariat and for that matter the Islamic world, would remain in a state of indifference of each other's problems and aspirations.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is not only the sentiment of religion and the socio-cultural heritage that have bound us but more so is our realization of the common objectives and goals founded on common interests and

aspirations. The best and enduring manner in which we can symbolise our solidarity is by fostering greater understanding both among ourselves as well as the world at large.

Since we achieved independence in Malaysia, we feel humbly proud to have made our little contribution to the cause of Islam. Islam is our national religion and in our National Ideology—the Rukunegara—Belief in God is our first principle. This principle has guided the actions of our Government, both in domestic and in international affairs.

It is this concern that has underlined our policy for the Middle-East, or to us here, West Asia. We support fully the cause of the Arab countries, most especially, the cause of the Palestinians, who have been driven out of their homes to exist on the goodwill of their brothers in the Arabic and other Muslim nations. We support all efforts to bring peace to this region, but not peace without justice. Justice calls for the return of the people of Palestine to their homeland. We pledge our full support to the peoples of Palestine and to the Arab nations in their efforts to achieve this end.

Distinguished Delegates,

I full share the view expressed by the Tunku on the negative attitude of some Western News Agencies in respect of reporting events in Muslim nations. It is therefore the duty of IINA to make up for these inadequacies and counter the preicious propaganda of our common enemy whose sole aim is to disrupt the Muslim unity. At the same time, I feel IINA has a prime duty not only to galvanise public opinion in Muslim countries but also to bridge the communication gap between Muslim countries which would ultimately reduce the area of differences and create an atmosphere of better understanding and co-operation among Muslim and Non-Muslim nations.

I am convinced that with the guidance of Almighty Allah, the task before you would be successfully discharged. The success of this Conference will be a significant contribution to the realization of the noble objectives of IINA and the Islamic Secretariat.

But, your task does not end with the establishment of a strong, viable and competitive news agency. The news agency that you will inaugurate and establish will have the task of correcting the

centuries of misinformation and distortion that have been the burden of Islam and Islamic Nations. IINA will have to be historians dedicated to the task of telling the true story of Islam and its nations to the rest of the world. You have to establish a crop of newsmen dedicated to telling the truth about the progress and the development of the Muslim peoples. IINA will have to be more than just another news agency. It will have to be the voice of the nations of Islam, in the full sense of the word, speaking out to all nations from the heart and soul of Islam.

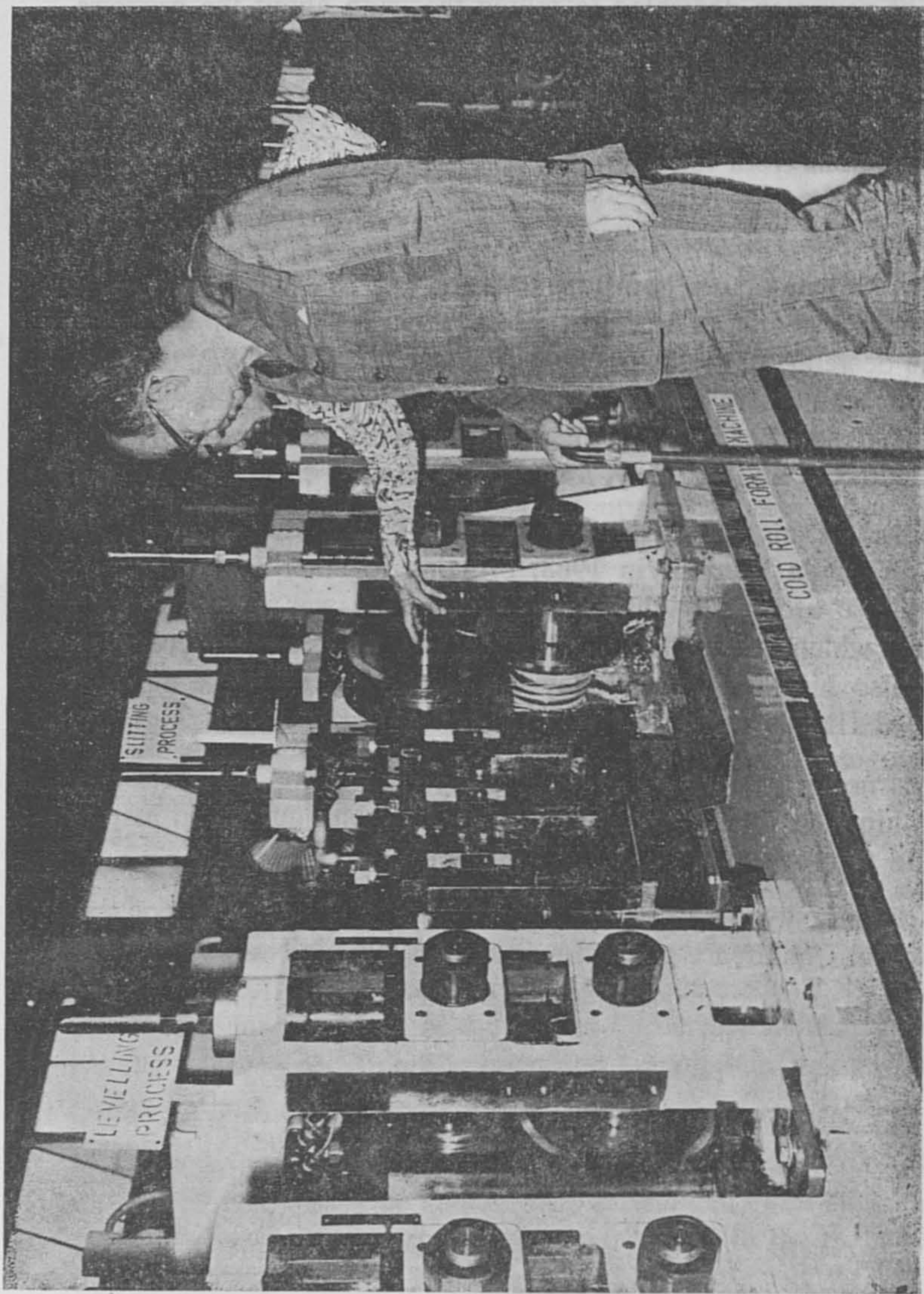
Distinguished Delegates,
