Arrival of the New Ambassador

His Excellency Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah, Ambassador of Malaysia to the Kingdom of Belgium presented his letters of Credence to His Majesty Philippe of Belgium, King of the Belgians on Thursday, 6 October 2016. The presentation of credentials was conducted in an official ceremony at the Royal Palace in the Belgium capital of Brussels. His Excellency Ambassador is concurrently accredited to Grand Duchy of Luxembourg. He is also the Head of Malaysian Mission to the European Union.

During the private audience following the ceremony, His Majesty the King expressed his satisfaction with the existing good and friendly bilateral relations between Belgium and Malaysia. He expressed the hope that the bilateral relations will be further strengthened particularly the area of economy and trade.

His Excellency Ambassador Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah shared the views of His Majesty the King and conveyed his commitments to further enhance bilateral relations in all fields of common interest, especially in economy and trade as well as people to people relations.

Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah is the 13th Ambassador of Malaysia to the Kingdom of Belgium. Prior to his appointment as Ambassador to the Kingdom of Belgium, Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah was Malaysia's Permanent Representative to ASEAN in Jakarta and had served as the Head of Mission in Wellington and Jordan.

Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah succeeds Dato' Nafisah Mohamed, who retired from the diplomatic service in June 2016.



31 August 2016 - Malaysians in Belgium and Luxembourg gathered at the official residence of the Ambassador, *Rumah Malaysia* to commemorate Malaysia's 59th National Day. The highlight of the event was the flag raising ceremony which was accompanied by the national anthem, *Negaraku*.

His Excellency Ambassador Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah in his address expressed appreciation for those who

WORKING VISIT OF YB DATUK SERI MAH SIEW KEONG, MINISTER OF MPIC TO BELGIUM

PROMOTING MALAYSIA'S SUSTAINABLE PALM OIL & TIMBER



5-6 September 2016 - YB Datuk Seri Mah Siew Keong, The Minister of Plantation Industries and Commodities (MPIC), led a palm oil and timber technical and promotion visit to Belgium. The delegation include Representatives from the Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB), the Malaysian Palm Oil Council (MPOC) and the Malaysian Timber Certification Council (MTCC).

The objective of the Mission focused on the following:

- To undertake discussions with relevant stakeholders pertaining to the production of Malaysian sustainable commodities particularly products of oil palm and timber;
- Correct the misperception of the usage of palm oil in food as reported

by the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) pertaining to palm oil's high level of 3-MCPD esters which is detrimental to health and unsafe for consumption; and

- To undertake high level discussions with Minister/ EU Commissioners regarding tariff and non-tariff barriers for market access by Malaysian commodities particularly products of oil palm and timber.

The programme for the two day Mission in Belgium among others include the Seminar on Malaysian Sustainable Palm Oil (MSPO) & 3-MCPD Esters and Glycidil Esters (GE), engagement with Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) & representatives from the private sector as well as the meeting with the Head of Cabinet for the Commissioner of Health and Food Safety of the European Commission (EC). A bilateral meeting with the Secretary of State for Infrastructure and Environment, The Netherlands was also convened at the sidelines of the Mission.



SEMINAR ON MALAYSIAN SUSTAINABLE PALM OIL (MSPO) AND 3-MCPD ESTERS AND GLYCIDYL ESTERS (GE)

YB Minister delivered a keynote address and officiated the Seminar which was aimed at disseminating information on measures undertaken by Malaysia to provide certified sustainable palm oil under the MSPO Certification Scheme. His Excellency Ambassador Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah delivered a short welcoming remarks.

The main focus of the Seminar was to enable MPIC to engage with the local industry players to explain the issue of 3-MCPD as well as to obtain feedback from the participants on managing and addressing all issues related to the anti-palm oil campaigns, especially by the NGOs.

The Minister in his speech reiterated that the Malaysian palm oil industry is one of the best regulated in the world. He also highlighted that continuous measures will be taken to supply the nutritional oil to the global community. In addition, the palm oil industry is of great national importance in which it provides employment opportunity to more than 1 million people. This industry also has contributed towards raising the income of the rural smallholders, whereby 40% of the total planted area is by smallholders.

It was attended by more than 100 participants comprising mainly representatives from Belgium major importers of palm oil, manufacturers of palm based food products and representatives from the EC.

The Seminar was a success with active participation from the participants which provided useful feedback for the Government to continue to address this issue. More importantly, MPOB was able to update them on the latest technologies in the refinement and reduction of contaminants in palm oil.



BILATERAL MEETING WITH HER EXCELLENCY SHARON DIJKSMA, STATE SECRETARY FOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND ENVIRONMENT, THE NETHERLANDS

YB Minister met with Minister Sharon Dijkma, State Secretary for Environment, The Netherlands on 5 September 2016 at the sidelines of the Mission. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss ways forward and progress on the Timber Procurement Assessment Committee (TPAC) of the Netherlands – Malaysian Timber Certification System (MTCS) process.

The meeting agreed that The Netherlands would send a team from TPAC on a technical visit to Malaysia with the objective of finalising the recognition of MTCS. The acceptance by TPAC of the MTCS would allow the use of Malaysian Timber in public procurement projects in The Netherlands. It was a fruitful meeting for both sides in making progress on the matter.



ENGAGEMENTS WITH MEMBERS OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE PRIVATE SECTOR

YB Minister also had engagements with Members of European Parliament (MEPs) and representatives from the private sector namely the European Palm Oil Alliance, Belgian Alliance for Sustainable Palm Oil, French Alliance

for Palm Oil and European Sustainable Palm Oil Advocacy Group.

The discussions were centred upon palm oil market access issues which includes the following:

- Ways to address palm related food safety concerns not only on technical and legal aspects, but also on restoring public confidence towards palm based products;
- Measures to promote the image of palm oil among others through the appointment of prominent personalities such as chef and other spokespersons;
- Initiatives to facilitate engagements between private sectors in Europe with the newly established Council of Palm Oil Producing Countries (CPOPC);
- Promotion of sustainable and certified palm oil under MSPO; and
- Engagement with Non-Governmental Organisation (NGOs) to address evolving issues related to palm oil.

The representatives from the private sector present were supportive and ready to work closely with Malaysia to address the anti-palm oil campaign.

MEETING WITH MR. VINCIUNAS, HEAD OF CABINET, HEALTH AND FOOD SAFETY, EUROPEAN COMMISSION

The objective of the meeting was to convey Malaysia's concerns on the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) report on 3-MCPD. The EFSA's report on 3 May 2016 had reported that palm oil contains the highest levels of 3-MCPD esters as compared to other vegetable oils which is a potential risk to public health.

The Meeting provided the opportunity for the EC to be informed of the number of activities undertaken by the Government of Malaysia in addressing the issue. The EC welcomed the initiatives undertaken by the Government of Malaysia to reduce the presence of 3-MCPD esters in palm oil particularly in the production of infant milk.

The Meeting also afforded Government of Malaysia to be informed of the possible regulatory measures to be undertaken by the EU in ensuring that the presence of these substances in food is as low as reasonably achievable to ensure a high level of food safety.

6 April 2016 - Malaysia and the European Union (EU) initialled the Framework Agreement on Partnership and Cooperation (MEUPCA) in Putrajaya. The initialing ceremony was held in the presence of YB Dato' Sri Reezal Merican Naina Merican, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Malaysia. The text of the agreement was initialled by the chief negotiators, YBhg. Dato' Ilango Karuppannan for Malaysia and H.E. Ranieri Sabatucci for the European Union (EU). H.E. Mr. Luc Vandebon, Ambassador of the EU Delegation to Malaysia, Senior Officials of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Attorney General's Chambers were also present.

The MEUPCA provides an overarching strategic political framework for strengthening Malaysia-EU bilateral cooperation. Since the negotiations of MEUPCA commenced in October 2010, eleven (11) rounds of negotiations had been held in Putrajaya and Brussels on a rotational basis. Malaysia and the EU successfully concluded the negotiations during the final round which was held on 7-8 December 2015 in Brussels.

The MEUPCA encompasses sixty (60) articles covering a broad field of common interest in economic and non-economic sectors for Malaysia and the EU. It serves as a catalyst to the strengthening of bilateral relations

between Malaysia and the EU and the enhancement of cooperation in wide-ranging areas including political relations, trade and investment, energy, transport, agriculture, finance, maritime affairs and other areas through dialogue and exchanges of information.

The MEUPCA is also an umbrella agreement that will provide the impetus in concluding other specific bilateral agreements. In particular, it will enable both sides to pursue Malaysia-EU Free Trade Agreement (MEUFTA) negotiations. The MEUFTA would give access for Malaysian products and services in the EU's huge market base. Malaysia will also benefit from capacity building programmes, the sharing of best practices and knowledge transfer in the areas of science and technology, green technology, environment, education and health.



7th HFCE International Halal Food Conference 2016

The 7th Halal Food Council of Europe (HFCE) International Halal Food Conference – Access to Halal Emerging Market with HFCE was held from 24-25 October 2016 at Sheraton Hotel Zaventem Airport. The biennial conference was organised by Halal Food Council of Europe (HFCE) and co-sponsored by Islamic Food and Nutrition Council of America. The Conference brought together both technical and regulatory group to discuss broad areas from future of halal regulatory to certification process and acceptable of level of alcohol in food and beverages.



HFCE is one of the largest halal certification bodies in Europe and is accredited by JAKIM (Malaysia), MUI (Indonesia), MUIS (Singapore) and MOEW (Egypt) as well as having a network of certification bodies around the world.

The tone of the Conference was set during the opening remarks by His Excellency Ambassador Dato' Hasnudin Hamzah, Ambassador to Belgium and Luxembourg and Mr. Iqbal Ahmed Qureshi, Director of HFCE, who presented the potential of halal market in Europe.

Throughout the Conference, more than 20 experts, regulators and industry players including auditors for certifying bodies in Asia, Europe and the US shared their knowledge with 100 attendees of the Conference.

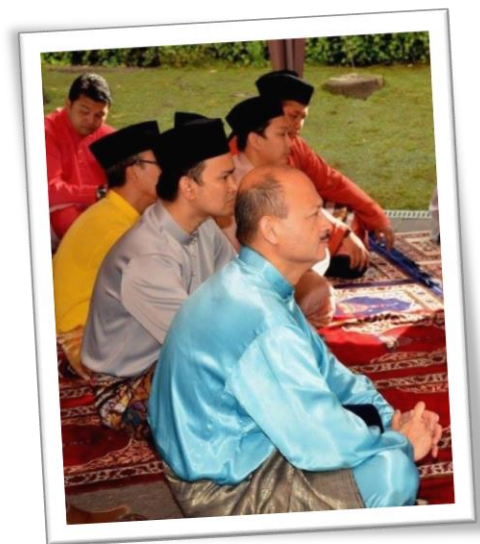

It was a proud moment to be able to showcase Malaysia to the world through our future- the younger generation. Indeed, it is never too early to imbue the appreciation of culture.

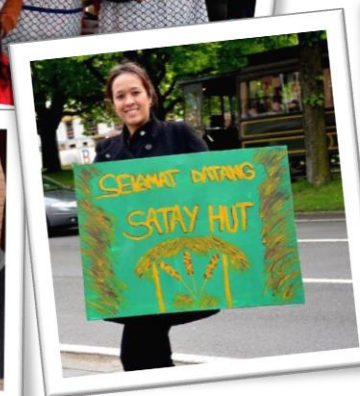


MALAYSIAN FOOD BAZAAR 2016
