OFFICIAL BIRTH OF NON -ALIGNED MOVEMENT (NAM)

The Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) formally emerged in the First Summit Conference of Heads of State and Government, held from 1 to 6 September 1961 in Belgrade, Yugoslavia (now Republic of Serbia), amid a complex international context marked by the Cold War (confrontation of East-West geopolitical blocs), the collapse of the colonial system in the world and the liberation struggle of the peoples of Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean.

MALAYSIA TO BOOST NAM PLANS IN VENEZUELA

Kuala Lumpur: Malaysia will state its commitment and initiatives to strengthen the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) at the two-day NAM Summit in Margarita Island, Venezuela.

Wisma Putra said the message would be conveyed by Deputy Foreign Minister Datuk Seri Reezal Merican Naina Merican in his speech at the summit which began on Saturday.

It said Malaysia's participation in the summit showed the country's continued commitment to the principles and struggles of NAM which comprised 120 member states. The 17th NAM Summit themed "United on the Path for Peace", will also celebrate the movement's 55th anniversary

It is hosted by Venezuela as the NAM chair for 2016-2019 taking over from Iran (2012-2016).

The summit is a forum for representatives of member countries to discuss and evaluate the

implementation of decisions made at the 16th Summit in Teheran in August 2012.

The summit is held every three years to formulate responses to regional and international issues, especially involving politics, security and development.

Malaysia has been a member of NAM since 1970 and chaired the movement from 2003 to 2006. It has been a member of its Committee on Palestine since 2002.

As NAM chair, Malaysia hosted the movement's 13th Summit in Kuala Lumpur in 2003, the first NAM Ministerial Meeting on Women's Development in Putrajaya (2005), 6th NAM Ministers of Information Conference in Kuala Lumpur (2005) and Ministerial Meeting of the NAM Coordinating Bureau in Putrajaya (2006)

Malaysia also established the NAM News Network under the Malaysian National News Agency (Bernama) and NAM Institute for the Advancement of Women (NIEW) under the Women, Family and Community Development Ministry, and has been funding the full operational costs of these two institutions, the statement said..

CONSULAR INFORMATION

PASSPORT RENEWAL

Effective March 1, 2009 all applications will be forwarded to Jabatan Imigresen Malaysia, Putrajaya, Malaysia for processing and approval via Diplomatic Bag which schedule once a month. The estimated time of process is between 3-6 months.

To ensure a prompt processing please make sure that all supporting documents are **certified by a Notary Public**, failure to do so will only delay your application.

All lost passport applications must go through a thorough investigation by Jabatan Imigresen Malaysia before any consideration can be made for its replacement. Passport is an important document therefore it must be in the safe custody of the holder at all times.

All applicants living in Venezuela **MUST** submit and collect document personally at the Embassy. Documents to be submitted are as follows:-

1. Application form (IM.42-Pin. 1/97) - 1 copy
2. Malaysian International Passport - original and 2 photocopies of the main page
3. Identity Card (original and 2 photocopies)
4. 4 recent colour photos (blue background, passport size)
5. Birth Certificate (original and 2 photocopies, if below 18 years old)

RM300 for 32 pages,
RM600 for 64 pages, will be based on current exchange rate.

REGISTRATION OF BIRTH

Children born in Venezuela can be registered at the Embassy of Malaysia in Caracas on the conditions:

- Father of the child is a Malaysian Citizen.
- Application is made within one year from the date of birth.
- *(For late registration, the application will be forwarded to the National Registration Department of Malaysia for processing and approval)*

Application has to be made by the parents with the child at :

Documents to be submitted:

1. Form D, JPN. WN02 (2 original form)
2. Passport of parents (original and 2 photocopies)
3. Identity Card of parents (original and 2 photocopies)
4. Birth Certificates of parents (original and 2 photocopies)
5. Marriage Certificate of parents (original and 2 photocopies)
6. Birth Certificates of child with English translation
7. 3 recent coloured photographs of child - size 3.5 x 5.0 cm

(based on current exchange rate)

The Embassy would then issue Form W (Malaysian Birth Certificate Overseas) will be issued by this office and a copy will be sent to the National Registration Department of Malaysia for record purposes.

REGISTRATION OF MARRIAGE

UNDER (MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE ACT 1976 OF MALAYSIA)

Marriage can be registered at the Malaysian Mission if at least one of the couple is a Malaysian citizen.

Non-Muslim citizens who contract marriage outside Malaysia MUST register the marriage with this office within the period of six (6) months from the date of marriage. This is a legal requirement and for the marriage to be legally recognized in Malaysia.

In order to register, both husband and wife must come to the Embassy together with the original and 2 sets of photocopies of the following :-

- Passport of the couple (page No. 1, 2 and 3)
- Malaysian Identification Card (photocopy both side)
- Local Marriage Certificate (and Divorce Certificate, where applicable)
- Two (2) passport size photographs (studio taken) each
- Registration fee of equivalent RM15.00 for registration made within (6) months from the date of marriage
- Penalty charge of equivalent RM100.00 will be imposed for late registration for the first consequence 6 months and RM 50.00 for every six months thereof

Registration will be processed by the Mission and two (2) copies of the Malaysian Marriage Certificate (original and a photocopy) will be issued to the couple.
