

Nearly half of M'sians think graft perception is better

The latest survey by the Performance Management and Delivery Unit (Pemandu) on the perception of corruption among Malaysians has found that 45 percent said their overall perception of graft in Malaysia has improved.

The proxy survey to the Transparency International Global Corruption Barometer conducted on 2,000 Malaysians by Pemandu from March to May 2011 showed a slight drop from 51 percent the previous quarter.

However, national key results area director in charge of reducing corruption D Ravindran said that this is an achievement as it was a marked improvement from 2009 when only about a third of Malaysians believed there were any improvements.

"This shows that Malaysian are starting to believe that it is a good place to do business," he told reporters after a media briefing on the Government Transformation Programme in Petaling Jaya today.
