

**Sue us if we're wrong, PAS Youth dares NRD**

PAS Youth said if they had been wrong on the recent exposes of various irregularities in the electoral roll, they would have been sued or hauled to court.

pas umno pemuda talks parliment 010709 nasrudin hassan Instead, the government has shifted into "denial syndrome" said national PAS Youth (DPPM) chief Nasrudin Hassan (right) in a statement today.

"Until now, no one has sued PAS Youth or hauled us to court over the many exposes that have been made.

"Instead, the Election Commission (EC) and National Registration Department (NRD) have only been replying through the media denying PAS Youth's (allegations)," he added.

He said DPPM was vindicated that a few days after exposing the issue of duplicate names, unidentified records and other irregularities, when 50,000 names were removed from the electoral roll.

"This is an unprecedented move, when in fact voter's names can only be removed when there is an objection, and upon receipt of the objection and the accompanying fee," he said.

NONE Nasrudin said DPPM only made its move after rigorous evaluation based on facts, proof and documents, to avoid slander or spreading false news.

"Such is the discipline we are forced to take, as every statement and disclosure will be scrutinised by our political foes who will be quick to take us to court if it were false or slander," he said.

He added that to date, DPPM through its democratic restoration bureau and rakyat's mobilisation chaired by Suhaizan Kaiat (left) and his deputy Mohd Adram Moses, many shortcomings and irregularities in the democratic electoral process have been brought to light.

Cops reputation in question

Nasrudin said the case this week with the 240 foreigners that the government says were merely attending a business course, shows that the police have also been hit by this "denial syndrome".

NONE He slammed the police destroying their reputation as defenders of the nation's security and sovereignty by siding with the alleged MyKad syndicate.

"The OCPD Sepang's explanation defies logic.

"Foreigners being given an entrepreneurial course? This is the first I have ever heard or seen such a thing.

"Perhaps in the spirit of Malaysia Boleh, anything can happen," he quipped, adding that such denials were an insult to the intellect of Malaysians.

"The rakyat deserve a convincing explanation, not some laughable excuse.

"Already the nation has been shocked with the statement in Parliament that 27,293 foreigners have been given citizenship in under four years (from 2008 - 2011)," added Nasrudin.

bangi resort foreigners citizenship 121011 On Wednesday, PAS tracked the convoy of buses ferrying allegedly Bangladeshis and Indonesians, who were said to be part of a scam to issue them citizenships.

Berita Harian yesterday carried the Sepang OCPD's explanation that the foreigners were at the resort to attend an "entrepreneurship course".

PAS members have however claimed that police presence and tight security at the course backed their suspicions.

Suhaizan, who is PAS Johor Youth chief, yesterday rubbished the Sepang OCPD's explanation, saying it was unbelievable that a group of foreign labourers from Johor Baharu, Johor under agricultural work permits, would be sent for business training all the way in Bangi, Selangor.
