

**'Hasan should train his guns on Obedient Wives Club'**

Selangor PAS Muslimat chief Wan Hasrina Wan Hassan today called on sacked former state commissioner to train his guns on the Obedient Wives Club (OWC), which has compromised Muslim faith, instead of taking aim at the party.

"I think this is the battlefield that Hasan Ali should be fighting in and not against PAS, there is clear distortion of faith here," she said at a press conference in Shah Alam.

Hasrina was responding to the OWC's move to portray Prophet Muhammad as a sex icon.

NONE Selangor PAS commissioner Abdul Rani Osman (left), who was also present at the press conference, said he hoped the Selangor Islamic Religious Council (Mais) should not let such an incident occur in the state.

"How can you use a holy person as a sex figure, this is ridiculous," he said.

Abdul Rani added that if Hasan was sincere about fighting for the Muslim faith he would not merely take aim at PAS.

Reading out from a statement, while flanked by the Selangor PAS' top leadership, its Youth chief Hasbullah Mohd Ridzwan blasted Hasan for turning away from PAS after losing positions in the party.

Hasbullah added that Hasan's relentless attacks were unjustified as PAS has not changed since the latter helmed the party's leadership in the state.

"He is willing to make unfounded allegations such as PAS sidelining ulamas (religious scholars), pawning Malay rights and bowing to DAP and PKR, but the fact is that nothing has changed since when he was Selangor PAS commissioner and state exco member.

"The only thing that has changed was that he has no positions in PAS," he said.

Hasbullah said that Hasan had begun creating problems after he was not reappointed as Selangor PAS commissioner and the situation came to a critical point after he found out that he had failed to secure enough nominations to defend his Gombak Setia state seat.

He added that while Hasan Ali claimed that PAS had sidelined the ulamas, he had defied the ulamas' advice to remain silent.

'Third force is day-dreaming'

Meanwhile, commenting on speculations that Hasan would lead a 'third force' in the coming general election, Abdul Rani dismissed it as "day-dreaming".

"Thus far I don't see it happening, I saw his interview on TV3, there was no information who the leaders would be or any details," he said.

He added that even if Hasan succeeds in setting up the movement, PAS would be unaffected.

"If he really wants to be the third force, then he should be criticising both PAS and Umno, but I'm sorry to say that he appears to be a barua (running dog) to Umno," said Abdul Rani.

Hasan has embarked on a roadshow following his sacking, launching attacks against PAS leaders including Abdul Rani.

Speculation has been rife that the sacked leader will use anti-apotasy group Himpun as a platform to "expose the parasites" in PAS.
