

Now it's EC's turn to show integrity, says PKR

PKR director of strategy Rafizi Ramli said it is now the Election Commission's turn to demonstrate integrity by coming clean on its indelible ink contract.

NONERafizi (left) said the EC should reciprocate his demonstration of integrity after he accepted the commission's challenge to repeat his allegations about the contract outside of the Dewan Rakyat without the benefit of parliamentary immunity.

"I think integrity is extremely important and I took the risk and repeated my claim outside the house so many times.

"If the EC put a similar premium on integrity and credibility, they should attend to the crux of the matter," said the Pandan MP.

Rafizi had claimed that the contracts for the defective indelible ink used by the EC in the general election were given to companies whose owner had close links to the commission's leadership.

He had fingered Integrated Challenger (M) Sdn Bhd and its owner Mohamed Salleh Mohamed Alli but Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Shahidan Kassim declined to confirm this.

EC chairperson Abdul Aziz Mohd Yusof and EC deputy chairperson Wan Ahmad Wan Omar have denied having any such links, but did not elaborate on the contract.

Malaysiakini have made repeated attempts to contact Mohamed Salleh including visiting his company's office but has yet to obtain a response.
