

## **Zul Noordin wants Anwar, local councillors fired**

Fomer PKR MP Zulkifli Noordin has urged Selangor Menteri Besar Abdul Khalid Ibrahim to sack PKR de facto leader Anwar Ibrahim as the state's economic adviser and also dismiss all local councillors in the state who are from PKR and DAP.

In a blog post recently, Zulkifli, who was also a deputy president with right-wing NGO Perkasa before this, asked Khalid to appoint six more PAS assemblypersons to fill up the vacant executive council posts and as a result, ensure an "Islamic" administration in Selangor.

"Show the greatness and goodness of an Islamic administration," Zulkifli said, directing the advice to PAS.

He also asked for the sacking of any PKR and DAP members in state-linked companies, and also that of Saifuddin Nasution, the PKR secretary-general, from his position as the state liaison officer.

"When the state assembly convenes, the MB must also sack the speaker and deputy speaker who are from DAP and PKR, and instead appoint an independent individual to become the next speaker - such as a former Federal Court judge," he said.

Zulkifli went on and proposed that all sacked councillors should be replaced only by PAS members or "suitable activists", effectively proposing a state government fully run by PAS and Khalid.

He claimed that even though Pakatan Rakyat had a two-thirds majority in the state assembly, "the greatness of Allah" had ensured that Khalid remained MB and scuppered plans for PKR president Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail to become MB.

This, he said, is because Wan Azizah has a "morality, ability, and credibility" deficit.

The fiery former Perkasa vice-president, who made a bid for the Shah Alam parliamentary seat under the BN ticket in the 2008 general election but lost to PAS' Khalid Samad, appeared ecstatic with the Selangor crisis.

"Allahu Akbar," he wrote repeatedly, ending his emphatic statement, "Adios amigos, gracias senor (sic)."
