

MP: New jet buy to ensure leader's safety

Abdul Azeez Abdul Rahim (BN-Baling) said the purchase of the executive jet was to ensure the safety of the country's leader while making visits at home and abroad.

"The aircraft is not owned by Prime Minister Najib Abdul Razak, but by the government," he said when debating the Yang di-Pertuan Agong's opening address in the Dewan Rakyat here.
