

**M'sia remains committed to the Bangsamoro peace deal, says Najib**

Malaysia will remain committed to the Bangsamoro peace deal for as long as it is desired, said Prime Minister Najib Abdul Razak.

Najib said this was because peace and harmony would benefit not only Mindanao and the Bangsamoro people, but also the Philippines and the region.

"We also urge all parties to continue to pursue these goals," he said in a statement hailing the relaunch of the Bangsamoro Peace Deal, in Kuala Lumpur today.

"I am very pleased that members of the government of the Philippines' new implementing panel and representatives of the Moro Islamic Liberation Front are meeting in Kuala Lumpur on Aug 13 and 14 to formally relaunch the implementing phase of the comprehensive agreement on the Bangsamoro," he said.

Najib said the peaceful resolution of a decades-long conflict that had cost the lives of tens of thousands, was a historical achievement.

"Malaysia has been proud to facilitate the negotiations that have contributed to delivering greater safety and stability in Mindanao, the Philippines and the region," he said.

He said Malaysia respects the sovereignty of other countries and consider foreign interference in the domestic affairs of others to be wrong.

"However, when requested by the government of a friend and neighbour, we are happy to provide all possible assistance," he added.

Najib said the determination shown by Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte and his vision in setting up the new peace roadmap remains crucial.

"While certainly there are challenges ahead, I am confident that under President Duterte's leadership, and with Malaysia steadfast in its role as an honest broker, a new era of development and prosperity in the southern Philippines can be achieved," he added.
