

Kit Siang queries Muhyiddin's gag order decision

KUALA LUMPUR - DAP veteran Lim Kit Siang has questioned the gag order given by Deputy Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin on Wednesday that there should be no further discussion on the "Allah" issue by any political parties.

Muhyiddin was reported as saying that the continuous debate over the use of the word "Allah" could "lead to an unhealthy situation."

The DAP stalwart, in his blog posting, referred to the principle of consensus that no action shall be taken by the Cabinet unless a full consensus is reached.

Lim said the Cabinet would not have imposed a gag order that stops public discussion on the call to revoke the "Allah" ban if four MCA ministers had objected against it.

MCA president Chua Soi Lek has urged on Wednesday to resolve the issue as soon as possible to prevent further exploitation from the Opposition.

Lim said, "The Umno stand on the 'Allah' controversy is untenable and exposes the mockery of Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak's 1Malaysia slogan and policy."

Lim also questioned if the MCA ministers will bring up the subject again after the Prime Minister returned from his overseas trip.
