

Nurul explains 'wolf in sheep skin' remark

KUCHING - PKR's MP for Lembah Pantai Nurul Izzah Anwar (*picture*) on Thursday urged all Malaysians to be careful not to allow certain groups with narrow and extremist ideas to pollute the politics in Malaysia.

In a press conference at the Kuching International Airport where she was leaving for Kuala Lumpur after having dinner with PKR leaders here Wednesday night, Nurul said when she spoke of wolf in sheep skin in her speech then, she was not referring to the former de facto law minister, Zaid Ibrahim, as assumed by certain quarters.

She said reports written about her being anti Azmin Ali and not a word was spoken between them was just "speculation".

Nurul said her father is neutral on who should be the No 2 man in the party.

She said as a leader, he did not want to indicate any support for anyone nor influence anyone on it.

Referring to the "wolf in sheep skin" remark, Nurul said she was merely looking at the context of police reports lodged against her for her article "Malaysia or Malaysaja" which earns her the ire of Perkasa when she called for a constructive dialogue with the Malay rights group chief Ibrahim Ali.

She said PKR is moving towards a reformed culture and to differentiate itself from the Umno brand of politics.

"We have a clear code of ethic and for the party during the elections. We are moving away from Umno kind of politics and money politics," she said.

On the PKR split in Kuching, Nurul said it is a natural process as it happens everywhere in all political parties.

Nurul also called on Sarawak PKR to register more voters. - MM
