

Zaid to fight it out with two others for PKR deputy presidency

PETALING JAYA – It will be a three-cornered fight for the PKR deputy president's post.

PKR Federal Territories chief Zaid Ibrahim has throttled down his ambition for the top post and instead would go for the No. 2 post in a tussle with party vice-president Azmin Ali and Perak chief Mustaffa Kamil Ayub.

According to *The Star*, Zaid said he had decided not to contest the number one post as his advisers said his chances of winning is higher if he goes for the deputy post instead.

He promised to promote party unity, revive inactive divisions and rebuild the strength of the party if given the mandate.

It is learnt that Selangor Mentri Besar Khalid Ibrahim, party elections director Fuziah Salleh, and Nurul Izzah Anwar, had decided to pull out of the race for the deputy presidency.

Incumbent party president Wan Azizah Wan Ismail was returned unopposed. Her agent submitted the nomination form at about 1.45pm Saturday.

The Wanita wing will see a three-cornered fight for the top post.

Incumbent Zuraida Kamaruddin is challenged by Dr Suraya Sudin and Animah Ferrar.
