

**PKR's No 2 spot to be announced Sunday due to Jenapala's lawsuit**

KUALA LUMPUR - The official results of Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) deputy presidential race will be announced on Nov 28 (Sunday), The Star reported.

The delay was due to a lawsuit filed by former PKR deputy secretary-general P.Jenapala to stop the party from declaring any candidate as having been elected as the deputy president.

The various parties on Monday reached a mutual understanding on an injunction application filed by Jenapala through his originating summons.

In his originating summons filed last Thursday, Jenapala stated that he was suing the party to get a declaration that he was entitled to contest the position of deputy president.

Jenapala named PKR president Datin Seri Dr Wan Azizah Wan Ismail, her deputy Dr Syed Husin Ali and secretary-general Saifuddin Nasution Ismail as defendants in their capacity as office bearers of the party.

The defendants' lawyer Ranjit Singh on Monday said that his clients had undertaken not to declare the election results of the deputy president's post until Sunday.

"We indicated to the judge that Article 43 of the PKR constitution only requires it to declare the election results at its national congress to be held from Nov 26 to Nov 28.

"Therefore, we have reached a mutual understanding on the injunction application," he said.

Ranjit said High Court (Appellate and Special Powers) judge Justice Aziah Ali has set Nov 25 to hear Jenapala's summons.

Jenapala is seeking a declaration that his disqualification as a candidate for the post of PKR deputy president was unlawful and contrary to his rights as a party member.

He claimed to have declared his intention on Sept 17 to run for the position in the party elections that began on Oct 29.

Jenapala stated that Saifuddin had issued a media statement on Sept 20 disqualifying him from contesting the elections.

He is seeking damages to be assessed, costs, interests, and any other relief deemed fit by the court.

Jenapala also stated that he was purportedly stripped of his membership without his knowledge and/or any notice given to him.
