

**Ronnie Liu shown the door in DAP polls**

PETALING JAYA - Controversial executive councillor Ronnie Liu has failed to get elected to the 15-man Selangor DAP committee.

The embattled Pandamaran assemblyman was jeered when his name was announced as one of the candidates in the state party polls Sunday. Liu could only muster 369 votes from the 1,015 delegates.

Senior executive councillor and Kinrara assemblyman Teresa Kok was the biggest winner of the day. Although she came in 11th with 437 votes, she was later elected state chief by the state committee.

The three fence-sitters – Janice Lee, Hannah Yeoh and Charles Santiago – came out in the top three places.

Janice Lee, the Teratai assemblyman had the highest number of votes - 703 votes - followed by Subang Jaya assemblyman Hannah Yeoh with 644.

Liu left minutes before the election results were announced and declined comment when contacted later.

Others who made it from Teresa Kok's team are Seri Kembangan assemblyman Ean Yong Hian Wah (sixth), Puchong MP Gobind Singh Deo (seventh), PJ Utara MP Tony Pua (eighth), Kampung Tunku assemblyman Lau Weng San (ninth), Serdang MP Teo Nie Ching (10th) and Tiew Way Keng (12th).

Teng's supporters who secured enough votes to get into the committee are Ng Suee Lim (fifth), Senator S. Ramakrishnan (13th), Lim Soo Hong (14th) and T. Kannan (15th).

Asked what she thought of the outcome of the state polls, Kok said the result was good.

"At the end of the day, we are all comrades and had some election time competition. We will now close ranks and work together as a team," she added.

Asked about Liu's departure from the state line-up, Teng said: "No comment is required about that as it is so clear for someone who finds it hard to reach the main gate."
