

Teresa: Death of man who burnt himself nothing to do with Selangor govt

KUALA LUMPUR - Selangor state executive councillor Teresa Kok said Thursday that the death of M. Chakragunasegaran, 52, has nothing to do with the state government.

Chakragunasegaran, who was the Puchong MIC division information chief, passed away on Tuesday after he set himself on fire in protest against the demolition of a Hindu Temple in Pusat Bandar Puchong on Nov 8.

The MIC Youth had blamed the Subang Jaya Municipal Council (MPSJ) over his death.

Telling the MIC to 'get their facts straight', Kok said: "I think they are just trying to lump everything into one, so they blame the Selangor government."

"It was a conflict between the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) members and the school board. Even the PTA and board said it was nothing to do with the temple," FMT quoted the newly-appointed state chairman as saying.

Kok said the state government had extended their condolences and donated RM2,500 to the Chakragunasegaran's family.
