

**PM: Read my lips, 1Malaysia for nation building**

KUALA LUMPUR – Najib Abdul Razak said today that the 1Malaysia concept was introduced for nation-building, and not for political expediency.

The Prime Minister said, this spirit of togetherness and the ability to rise above political differences are important in ensuring continued peace and stability in the country.

"Although some might like to think it (1Malaysia) is for political purposes, it is actually for nation-building," he said.

"It is for us to come together, for us to feel that we belong to one nation, one people with one vision, and that is for us to march forward together to develop a truly prosperous, harmonious and successful 21st century nation," he said at the Christmas Tea Party hosted by the Archbishop of Kuala Lumpur, Murphy Pakiam, at the Archbishop's residence here.

Najib added: "In today's world where a small group of extremists has drowned the voices of reason and common sense and hijacked the agenda of peace and moderation, it is important for the moderates in every faith - Muslims, Christians, Hindus and Buddhists - among us to speak up to reclaim our rightful place and the moral high ground."

Najib also said that religion taught us to be tolerant, caring and respectful of the beliefs and practices of others.

"We are bound by our common destiny. We are bound by our common heritage. We are bound by our need to forge ahead as one nation to face the challenges that lie ahead," he said.

Najib also reminded Malaysians not to forget the message of Christmas which is peace, hope, charity, love and goodwill towards all men.

"This message is not only for Christians. This message is for all people," Bernama quoted him as saying.

Also present was Najib's wife, Rosmah Mansor, Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Dr Koh Tsu Koon, foreign dignitaries and opposition leaders.

At a separate Christmas function, Information, Communication and Culture Minister Dr Rais Yatim said 84% of Malaysians understood the 1Malaysia concept, more than the 75% targeted.

This was found in a survey carried out by his ministry from June to July which also showed 72% accepting the concept, he said, adding that 15,353 respondents were involved in the survey.

Rais said that a poll of 12,212 in October last year showed 69% understood the concept.

He said that all should strive to help realise the concept regardless of their political affiliation.
