

**Hishammuddin Shoots Down Khalid's Request For Auxiliary Police Team**

PUTRAJAYA -- Selangor Menteri Besar Abdul Khalid Ibrahim's proposal to form an auxiliary police team in the state is tantamount to not appreciating the police force which maintains peace and security in the country.

Home Minister Hishammuddin Tun Hussein said the reason (for the auxiliary police team) given by Abdul Khalid was to reduce the crime rate in the state.

However, he said, the crime index in Selangor was already on the decline.

Thus, Hishammuddin said, he viewed it (the menteri besar's proposal) as denying the police successes over the years, especially in the context of National Key Result Areas which clearly showed that the crime index and crime cases in Selangor indicated a downward trend.

He was speaking to reporters after receiving a courtesy call from the Canadian prime minister's Special Advisor for Human Trafficking and Illegal Immigrants, Ward Elcock, and Canadian High Commissioner to Malaysia Randolph Mank, at his office here yesterday.

Hishammuddin also described the idea as a waste of public money, which should otherwise be spent for the interest and development of the people.

Three days ago, Abdul Khalid was reported to have sent a letter to Hishammuddin to consider the proposal after the one he sent to Deputy Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin in June last year, did not receive any response.
