

Subramaniam Gets Court Order Against Samy Vellu

KUALA LUMPUR -- Former MIC deputy president S. Subramaniam and two others today obtained a court order to restrain Maju Institute of Educational Development chairman S.Samy Vellu from admitting 10 new members into MIED.

High Court judge Mohamad Ariff Md Yusof granted an interim injunction to the three plaintiffs after hearing submissions from both parties in chambers today.

On March 1, Subramaniam and the other two, former MIC Youth chief S. Vigneswaran and Kedah MIC deputy chairman S. Ganesan, filed the injunction application at the High Court naming MIED, Samy Vellu and several board of trustees as defendants.

Counsel T. Rajasekaran and A.Vasanthi represented the plaintiffs while Chetan Jethwani acted for the defendants.

Vasanthi told reporters that the judge granted the interim injunction to the trio until March 14, whereby the judge will decide whether to extend it until MIED's emergency general meeting to be held within two months of March 1.

The three had submitted a requisition to MIED's company secretary last Wednesday to call for the EGM to remove Samy Vellu as the trustee in MIED.

In the application, Subramaniam, Vigneswaran and Ganesan had sought for interim injunction to restrain Samy Vellu to admit new members into MIED in the board of trustees meeting scheduled today.
