

IGP's Term Of Service Extended

KUALA LUMPUR -- The term of service of Inspector-General of Police Ismail Omar has been extended by two years effective from Tuesday with the consent of Yang di-Pertuan Agong Tuanku Mizan Zainal Abidin.

Home Minister Hishammuddin Tun Hussein said the extension was also approved by Prime Minister Najib Tun Razak.

"The extension will give him the opportunity to continue providing the best service not only to the Royal Malaysian Police but also to society and the nation as a whole," he told a press conference at Bukit Aman here.

He said the strong collaboration between Ismail Omar and the new deputy IGP, Khalid Abu Bakar, would ensure earnest efforts in maintaining peace and security.

Ismail was appointed IGP in Sept 2010 to succeed Musa Hassan.

Hishammuddin said that Ismail will announce the appointment of a new director soon to enhance the police administrative team.
