

Be More Committed, Selangor Sultan Tells The Judiciary

SHAH ALAM -- The Sultan of Selangor, Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah reminded court officials to be more committed in discharging their responsibilities so that court cases could be disposed of in a speedier manner.

The Sultan also urged members of the public to continue to support the judiciary in efforts to uphold the sovereignty of the law.

He said that as the Ruler in the state, he was deeply concerned about the needs of the people in Selangor with regard to peace and security.

"In this regard, the judiciary in the state must play a more collective and proactive role to uphold the sanctity of the law," he said when officially opening the RM93.1 million Annex Building of the Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Court Complex, here yesterday.

He expressed satisfaction that the Selangor Lower Court had succeeded in resolving 76 per cent of criminal cases in 2010 compared with 70 per cent in 2009.

The Ruler said that in line with the increasing number of criminal cases, the judiciary must plan and look for the best approach to resolve the cases swiftly and efficiently without compromising the sovereignty of the law in the state

Sultan Sharafuddin also thanked the Federal Government for approving the allocation for the court's annex building which could meet the growing requirement of the existing court complex.
