

PAS Is Only Acting That They Are Sensitive To Feelings Of Non-Muslims On Hudud

PAS spiritual advisor Nik Aziz can be sensitive to other races and religion simply because they do not have the necessary numbers to amend the Federal Constitution to allow them to implement hudud laws.

So the question is, why has DAP Secretary-General Lim Guan Eng not responded to the challenge by MCA Vice-President Gan Ping Sieu to debate on how they plan to prevent the implementation of hudud?

If Nga Kor Ming can express confidence that PAS will not be successful in their goal of implementing hudud, then Guan Eng should not try to escape from the debate as there is no more need for talk on the constitutional guarantee of religious freedom and he has no need to always divert attention by changing the subject.

If DAP wants to talk on guaranteeing religious freedom, then they should look within themselves first as PAS is the only political party which has made its stand openly to amend the Constitution to allow hudud laws to be implemented.

UMNO and MCA have both made our stand clearly, that we do not wish to implement hudud. DAP does not wish to debate with PAS which had planned to amend the Constitution to allow hudud, but instead wishes to debate with MCA which has no intention to allow hudud laws to be implemented. This is illogical of DAP.

Nik Aziz is now acting sensitive to the needs of other races and religions as he does not have the requirements needed to implement hudud yet, but if Pakatan manages to win the elections, they might plan to join together with Anwar Ibrahim's PKR, who had earlier said that he supports the implementation of hudud, and sideline DAP's number of seats in Parliament, thus having the needed requirement of MPs to amend the Constitution to allow hudud laws.

Therefore, we should be more concern about DAP and PKR and whether or not they can convince PAS to give up their goal of implementing hudud laws.

This is the problem which we should look at and solve, instead of turning against MCA.
