

All Are Not Equal In Pakatan

The remark DAP stalwart Lim Kit Siang made where he claimed that "in Pakatan Rakyat, no political party plays the role of Big Brother" thereby suggesting that there is no status differentiation in Pakatan Rakyat is merely self deception to make himself feel good.

There have been numerous occasions where DAP's statements were classified as personal opinions which did not and cannot represent Pakatan's stand.
