

Why Can't DAP Nominate Own Candidate To Be MB?

The comment by DAP Perak chairman Ngeh Koo Ham that only Malays can be appointed as Menteri Besar as reported in Sin Chew Jit Poh (29 Feb 12) is an admission and in agreement with the remarks by MCA President Dr Chua Soi Lek that a vote for DAP is a vote for PAS to rule the entire country's administration.

DAP creates an illusion for the Chinese community that DAP will emerge dominant in all other states by constantly promoting Penang which is under their governance. In reality, besides Penang, other states cannot be helmed by DAP. The MCA President speaks the truth which no other DAP leaders dare to refute.

The best example is Perak. During the 2008 General Elections better known as 208, 18 DAP state assemblymen (ADUN) were elected, PAS had 6 ADUNs, and PKR, 7 ADUNs. Theoretically, DAP should be the leader, but it ended up that the Menteri Besar was sourced from PAS.

After 308, Pakatan Rakyat gained administration 5 states. But at the end of the day, 3 Menteri Besars hail from PAS. Although DAP repeatedly stresses that the three parties in Pakatan enjoy equal status, DAP secured governance of only 1 state.

Moreover, PAS has declared that once they rule Johor, the Menteri Besar will also stem from their party. PAS' repeated statements of turning Malaysia into an Islamic state is no longer a wishful thinking but a reality.

PAS' bent to implement PAS hudud law also crushes Ngeh's and DAP's illusion. By remarking that DAP could not be the Menteri Besar, Ngeh has forgotten DAP's impression to the public as a multiracial party.

DAP keeps reiterating that they are a multiracial party. But now Ngeh says that the Perak state Constitutions enshrines that only a Malay can become the Menteri Besar, and thus a DAP ADUN could not become Menteri Besar. If DAP is truly a multiracial party, how could they do not have any Malay candidates to be Menteri Besar?

From here, it is very obvious that DAP is a Chinese-based political party. Their claims of being a multiracial party should just be taken with a pinch of salt.
