

DAP Exaggerates Licence Plate Issue To Divert Attention

In an attempt to cover up their own shortcomings and questionable practices in Pakatan-helmed states, DAP and their Secretary-General Lim Guan Eng are trying to divert the public's attention by exaggerating the issue of MCA Deputy President Liow Tiong Lai's bid for the WWW 15 licence plate.

DAP leaders will do anything to get more votes, and will not hesitate to use any means to slander and create a bad image for MCA and Barisan Nasional.
