

Khaled: Malaysians have faith in Abdullah's administration

PUTRAJAYA: Malaysians have faith in Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi's handling of government administration and policies despite Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad's reservations.

Entrepreneur and Co-operative Development Minister Datuk Mohamed Khaled Nordin said yesterday that the people realised that what the Prime Minister was doing was in their best interest.

This contradicted the former Prime Minister's assumption that many were dissatisfied with the Government's decision to revert his plans and policies.

Khaled said the solid support from the grassroots, as conveyed to their respective Members of Parliament, showed that the people had confidence in Abdullah's leadership.

Singling out the Government's move to scrap the project to build a new bridge across the Straits of Tebrau, he said the majority of the people of Johor had no qualms with (he decision.

"I am from Johor too. My constituents agree with the Government: Feedback from other divisionals also indicates that the majority concur with the Government in the matter.

"You can ask (all Johor MPs), Datuk Seri Syed Hamid Albar, Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin and Datuk Shahrir Samad (Johor Baru MP) and they will tell you the same.

"There are, of course, people who want it (the bridge) but most realise, without it, life does not end," the Pasir Gudang MP said, adding it was wrong for Dr Mahathir to assume that the people of Johor wanted the bridge.
