

39 projects worth RM1.7b for police

KUALA LUMPUR : The Government, through Syarikat Pembinaan BLT Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of the Ministry of Finance Incorporated, has identified 39 projects worth RM1.775 billion to be implemented for the benefit of the police force.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi yesterday said the projects formed part of

the Government's continuous efforts to equip the force with housing and other facilities.

The move is intended to make the country's police force a high calibre and efficient institution, Abdullah said in a press statement released by the Finance Ministry here.

Abdullah, who is also Finance Minister, said the projects would

be given out through a Bumiputera-limited tender process from August till December.

The projects include the building of headquarters, police stations, logistics complexes training centres, lock-ups, laboratories and housing for police personnel throughout the country.

Among the projects to be tendered would be the marine base

in Semporna, Sabah, the Subang Jaya district police headquarters and the Pahang police contingent's headquarters.
