

Dr M vows to keep on asking questions

PUTRAJAYA: Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad has vowed to keep on raising questions "until I'm answered" and pledged to reveal evidence of wrongdoings, including corruption.

The former premier said there were several other issues which he would raise, adding it would come out one at a time.

When pressed to reveal more, Dr Mahathir said "I am not willing to discuss the details of that as yet."

He said that no one who was corrupt

would admit to receiving money and neither would the person who gave the money come forward to admit the act.

"If you want evidence that way, you can never get evidence. There is an agency (the Anti-Corruption Agency) that investigates (corruption) and the agency should be allowed to investigate without any interference from politicians," he told reporters.

He had earlier delivered a keynote address entitled *Positioning Malaysia in the World Arena* organised by Perdana

Leadership Foundation.

Dr Mahathir said during his premiership, he had wanted some form of censorship on the Internet with regard to pornography and violence, and that the present Government had the authority to introduce new laws covering the use of the Internet.

Asked to comment that it was his criticisms that had caused the Government to review Internet laws, Dr Mahathir likened it to "using a hammer to kill a mosquito".
