PETALING JAYA: Award-winning actress Maya Karin is feeling "a little bit better" now that Umno Youth deputy chief Khairy Jamaluddin has killed off rumours of their so-called marriage.

The actress has denied on a TV talk show on Friday "night that she" was married, adding that she was surprised how such rumours could have surfaced.

Earlier in the day, Khairy had also blasted those who started and spread the rumours, saying that he has only one wife - Nori Abdullah (the Prime Minister's daughter).

"NOW that We have both come out with our statements, I definitely feel a little bit better," Maya told *The Star* yesterday.

"I think Khairy has made it quite clear and indisputable about the rumour.
