

Please patch up, PM and Dr M urged

TIDE Mahathir Abdullah spat continues to be a popular issue raised in debates by delegates to the Umno general assembly.

Among the most passionate was Selangor's Datuk Mufti Shuib, who stressed the use of the word "please, please anil please".

He said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi and his predecessor, Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, should reunite for the Malays. "We admire the past leader (Mahathir), we support the present leader (Abdullah); Please unite again for the Malays," he said.

"We urge them, please don't make the life of the Malays difficult because of a minor spat"

Mufti said Abdullah visited Mahathir immediately when the latter was admitted to hospital and this showed Abdullah as a true Muslim and Malay.

"It is inappropriate to question the contributions of past leaders. We did not inherit the struggle from the past leaders. But we need to pay up whatever we owe to our future generation.

"Party members were not interested to grab positions in the party previously.

"After 57 years, it is a totally different scenario today. Fifty-seven years ago, we just started to learn how to rule a country... after 400 years of colonisation, we need to learn from our mistakes."
