

Khir: Our job to serve all

No selective service allowed

THE services provided by Barisan Nasional assemblymen in Selangor are being closely monitored to identify those who have failed to serve fairly and justly.

Mentri Besar Datuk Seri Dr Mohamad Khir Toyo said he had received complaints over the services provided by a few assemblymen who were only keen to help those affiliated to their component party or were from a specific race.

"This is against the Barisan spirit and assemblymen in the state had been reminded not to resort to this type of selective service. I cannot tolerate it especially when it happens despite the numerous reminders to assemblymen to serve without prejudice," he said after witnessing the swearing in of Ijok assemblyman K. Parthiban.

Khir said he would look into how the assemblymen spent the RM500,000 allocation handed out to each of them annually for projects in their respective constituencies.

He said the money should be spent to benefit each race based on the racial composition of the constituency.

Khir said he had instructed state exco member Datuk Fatah Iskandar to look into the services provided by all the assemblymen.
