

Nazri warns 'fiery' speakers of action

KUALA LUMPUR: The law will be allowed to take its course. Speakers at the Umno general assembly who had flouted the law will not be spared.

Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Datuk Seri Nazri Aziz said those who had spoken out of line at the party assembly should be prepared to face the consequences.

"When it was telecast live, the assembly was no longer a party matter confined to the Putra World Trade Centre but it became a public event.

"Those who made speeches which were seditious will face the music."

The police would investigate the matter and make their recommendations to the Attorney-General.

the reports prepared by the police. Let the law take its course," he said at the Parliament lobby here yesterday.

Nazri was asked to comment on Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak's statement that Umno had identified several speakers

deemed as being "extreme".

To date, two police reports have been made against some speakers at the assembly.

The first was lodged by DAP and the second, a non-governmental organisation.
