**PEKAN:** A website to send complaints and ideas to Prime Minister Datuk Seri Abdullah Ahmad Badawi has been launched.

The website, [www.warkahuntukpm.com.my](http://www.warkahuntukpm.com.my) was announced yesterday by Abdullah's deputy, Datuk Seri Najib Razak, here yesterday.

"It is going to be an important interactive channel which will contribute to the betterment of the people in this country," said Najib.

"We will keep this website open beyond the election to keep tabs on the people's attitudes and views on issues af-

fecting their lives."

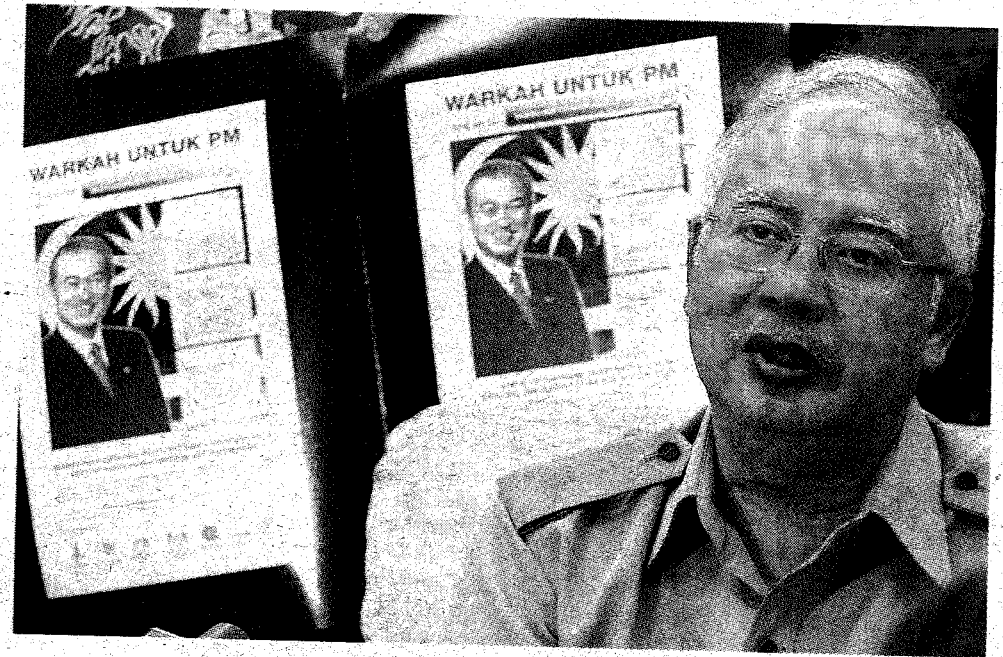
Najib said the website would allow the people to feel closer to the government.

The first 100 people who come up with good ideas for the government to consider will have the opportunity to meet the prime minister in person.

The website is an initiative by a group of non-governmental organisations with Abdullah's agreement.

Malaysian angkasawan Dr Sheikh Muszaphar Shukor will act as an ambassador for the website to promote its use.

The seven non-governmental organisations involved in the project will manage the website, ensure follow-up ac-

tion and that all emails reach the prime minister.

The project is under the joint chairmanship of Malay Research and Strategy Foundation chairman Tan Sri Hashim Meon and Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia vice-chancellor Professor Datuk Dr Sharifah Hapsah Syed Hasan Shahabudin, who is also president of the National Council of Women's Organisations.

The other NGOs are the Malaysian Malay Chamber of Commerce, Federation of Malaysian Consumers Associations, Cuepacs, Tabung Amanah Muhibah and Malaysian Workers Foundation.

The website operates in English, Bahasa Malaysia, Chinese and Tamil.

On the election campaign, Najib said there was no need for Barisan Nasional to enter-

tain a challenge for a public debate by Pas president Datuk Seri Abdul Hadi Awang.

"That is the way of the opposition.

"We give everyone the freedom to campaign but it is the people who will decide the outcome."

He said the BN was fine-tuning its strategy as the campaigning period reached its halfway mark.
