Charity golf tournament in honour of Tunku

KUALA LUMPUR, Sun. — The country's first Prime Minister Tunku Abdul Rahman's love for golf and charity is well known and his friends are organising a biennial golf tournament in his honour on May 22.

Being held for the fifth time, the tournament has a special significance this time around as it will be held at the Kelab Golf Negara Subang, a course which is the brainchild of the Tunku and built with a government allocation made possible by him.

Another added attraction at this year's tournament is the participation of the Yang di-Pertuan Agong

Tuanku Syed Sirajuddin and other prominent government leaders.

The tournament's organising committee chairman Tan Sri Dr Majid Ismail, said 120 people were expected to take part in the meet with the participation fees being RM500 for individuals and RM5,000 for companies.

Proceeds from the tournament will benefit Tasputra Perkim, Rumah Amal Cahaya Tengku Ampuan Rahimah, the National Heart Foundation and the Miriam Home for the Aged in Kluang, Johor.

morial Golf Tournament is the brainchild of the Methodist Afternoon School Old Boys Association.

Dr Majid, the former Health Ministry director-general, said not only did the Tunku create a huge following for the game, he also made many decisions on the running of the country and diplomatic issues on the golf course.
