PM: We honour all our promises

KUALA TERENGGANU: Datuk Seri Najib Razak said the Barisan Nasional government had always made it a point to fulfil all its promises and was willing to be rejected by the people if it failed to honour them.

“As a responsible government, we hold to our principles, including honouring our promises.

“This is not a political game because as Muslims, we should never break our promises,” Najib, who is prime minister and BN chairman, said during breaking of fast with the people in Kampung Padang Nenas, near here, yesterday.

Present were Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Ahmad Said and Kuala Nerus member of parliament Datuk Mohd Nasir Ibrahim Fikri.

Najib said a Muslim could be deemed as *munafik* (hypocrite) if he or she lied, broke promises or betrayed someone’s trust.

He said the people also preferred trustworthy elected representatives in the government.

Therefore, BN leaders and members should never be afraid of the opposition as long as they follow the true teachings of Islam, including honouring their promises.

“That is why more people are supporting us now, because they know we won’t lie or give empty promises.”

Najib also said Muslims should be grateful as they could fulfil their religious obligations without any problem as the country was peaceful and did not face economic slowdown.

At the function, Najib presented robes to imam and religious leaders and aid to the underprivileged.

He later performed *maghrib* prayers at the Kampung Padang Nenas mosque before performing *isyak* and *tarawih* prayers at the Wakaf Tembusu mosque, near here.
