# PM: Various projects show we can deliver

**KUANTAN:** The various development projects and infrastructure improvements in the country are proof of the government's capability in making changes from within.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak said a RM78 million flood mitigation project in Sungai Isap near here, which has 15,000 residents, had rid the area of perennial floods.

The project, started two years ago, proved that the government met the people's needs.

"Sungai Isap is no longer synonymous with floods, unless the rain is extraordinarily heavy," he said during a visit to the Sungai Isap

flood mitigation project.

Najib arrived in a RapidKuantan bus after going for a short tour around the town after his earlier function at the new Kuantan Sentral express bus terminal.

Najib added that the Federal Government would allocate more funds to the state government for flood mitigation.

Earlier at Kuantan Sentral, Najib announced that the people here would enjoy free bus services by RapidKuantan until May 31.

The free service was supposed to end this month after RapidKuantan was launched on Dec 1 last year.

"Initially, we planned to give the free service for only one month but the overwhelming response from the people prompted us to extend it.

"The ultimate indication that Malaysia is a developed nation is when the people opt for public transport although they could own a vehicle," Najib said.

To be opened in June, the RM55 million Kuantan Sentral centralised express bus terminal would have 18 waiting bays for buses, 48 ticketing counters and shoplots.

It will also have 354 bays for cars and 177 lots for motorcycles.
