# 'Nation heading for brighter future'

**PUTRAJAYA:** The current government can guarantee peace, stability and make changes to suit the people's personal aspirations, especially youth, said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak last night.

He said there were nations which enjoyed peace and stability yet could not make changes.

"If Malaysians want changes, we can make it happen. Have faith in today's government because we are heading to a brighter future," said Najib to loud applause from more than 2,000 university students and staff who had turned up to break fast with the prime minister at his official residence here.

Present was the prime minister's wife Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor.

Najib cautioned young Malaysians not to be easily duped by empty promises and urged them not to resort to street demonstrations for changes as seen in several nations in the Middle East which only led to disappointment.

"Under the current administration, with its track record and commitment to ensure continued progress, the people do not have to worry."

He told the university students that the government under his leadership would always ensure there would be enough allocation for the nation's educational needs.

"We will continue to improve the educational sector and this cannot be done at short notice."
