Open dialogue with Najib

'NOTHING TO HIDE': NGOs and public can pose questions on any issue to PM

PRIME Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak will answer questions put forth by non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and the public at a dialogue themed "Nothing to Hide". SukaGuam chairman Datuk

Khairul Anwar Rahmat said representatives of NGOs could pose questions on any issue, including Malaysia Development Bhd (IMDB), the sale of land by the Tabung Haji Board and the implementation of the Goods and Services Tax (GST).

He said the programme's main purpose was to fulfil the requests of many NGOs who wanted to meet

Najib, exchange thoughts and have a face-to-face dialogue with the prime minister.

"They are free to ask him any questions, be they on his leadership, the economy, consumerism or current issues," he said here yesterday.

The dialogue, Khairul said,

would prove that the government had nothing to hide and the rakyat were free to clear their doubts on any issues with Najib.

Besides that, he said SukaGuam welcomed all print and electronic media, bloggers, as well as the general public interested in the live dialogue at the Putra World Trade



Centre between 9am and 12pm this Friday.

He said there would be big screens placed at several locations to ensure the people in Sabah and Sarawak would be able to follow the session.

On whether SukaGuam was ready to welcome Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad to the dialogue, Khairul said it was an open forum and that SukaGuam had no issues if the former prime minister wanted to participate.
