Biggest 3D art museum opens

THE biggest 3D Art Museum in Malaysia, and the second biggest in the world, officially opened yesterday.

Art in Paradise Langkawi, located at Oriental Village in Pantai Kok here, cost RM17 million to build.

Former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad opened the museum, which is divided into nine zones, and set to be the latest at-

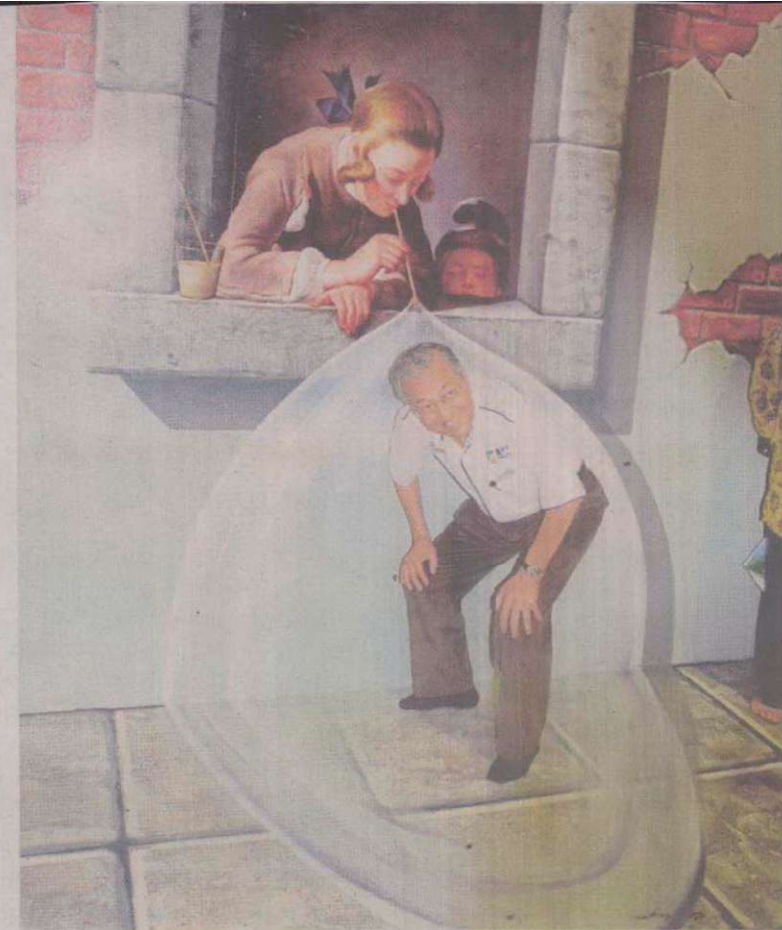
traction on the island.

In his speech, Dr Mahathir said Art in Paradise Langkawi would add value to existing tourism products in the popular travel destination.
